Two junior researchers from the Habitat Unit at TU Berlin, together with a team from local NGO Kota Kita (specialized in community engagement and participatory planning methods) and one of Indonesia's leading universities - Gadjah Mada - Institute of Architecture and Planning, conducted visits to potential case studies and joint proposal writing workshops in the cities of Surakarta, Semarang and Yogyakarta in November 2022. As a result, the team of partners worked jointly on developing two proposals targeting SDG 11, 13 and 17. The first proposal focused on promoting net-zero cities with youth groups in Indonesia and was submitted to the German Federal Government's International Climate Initiative for funding as a project outline in December 2022. The idea for the second proposal was conceptualized and focused on climate change-responsive housing in a self-built and incremental context (with a planned submission date in 2023). During the visits, the researchers comprehensively discussed both research topics and detailed the first ideas to support SDG implementation at local level.
