COURSE DETAILS

Study Courses	Generally, all courses are open to exchange students. Course attendance in the departments of Architecture and Landscape Planning is limited, though. Additionally, access to courses of the double degree/master program "Innovation Management, Entrepreneurship and Sustainability" (IMES) is restricted.
Course Catalogue & Course Language	Most of the courses (90%) are taught in German but we also offer a number of English taught courses (subject to change). The course offerings vary from semester to semester but usually courses that are offered during one summer or winter semester will be offered again the next summer or winter semester. The final course list is only available shortly before the semester starts, i.e. in late February/March (summer semester) and late August/September (winter semester). -General Course Information -Online Course Catalogue

ECTS	For the successful attendance of courses students receive ECTS credits. In few cases these ECTS credits have to be converted from SWS (weekly contact hours) or Leistungspunkten (LP), though.





LANGUAGE DETAILS

Language Requirements	Students who apply for a German taught study course can apply with German proficiency on at least A2.2 level of the CEFR but additionally a certificate on B1 level or higher must be provided before the semester starts.
	Only special program students, students working on their thesis and students who will attend an English taught study field can instead provide an English language certificate on B2 level.
Language Certificates	Certificates have to be issued by certified language institutes.
Pre-semester German intensive Courses	Preceeding each semester TU Berlin's <u>ZEMS</u> (Zentraleinrichtung Moderne Sprachen) offers <u>pre-semester German intensive courses</u> . ERASMUS+ students are only allowed to attend these courses from level B1 on and higher!

Housing	The International Office has a very small dormitory room contingent provided by the StudierendenWERK Berlin. Students can apply but also have to be prepared to look for housing on the free market. Detailed dorm room application information will be provided after the students' acceptance.
Living Expenses	Housing: between €400-600 per month Food/Drink: approx. €250 per month Books: €30 (depending on the field of study) Public transport: €49 per month for the "Deutschlandticket" - the semester ticket is no longer available! Student social fund contribution: approx.€65 per semester Please note that the figures mentioned in our FAQs merely represent a rough estimate.
Health Insurance/other Insurances	Health Insurance Exchange students have to register with a German statutory health insurer or get private health insurance and apply for a waiver of the statutory health insurance requirement upon arrival in Berlin. Third Party Liability Insurance It is the students' responsibility to acquire an insurance (from home) for personal belongings, accidents and third-party liability while studying in Germany. TU Berlin cannot not cover any losses that may occur.
Student Jobs	It is difficult to find a <u>student job</u> in Berlin, so international students should not base their finances on a student job.
Visa	If necessary the sending and receiving institutions will provide assistance in securing student visas for inbound and outbound mobility participants, according to the requirements of the ERASMUS+ Charter for Higher Education
