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HOUSING

Exchange students can apply for one of our dorm rooms provided by the studierendenWERK Berlin (rent: \in 350 - \in 400). About two weeks after each exchange application deadline students will be informed about the particulars of the dorm application but have to be aware that housing is not guaranteed.

Those students who want to look for private accommodation or did not get a dorm room should arrive in Berlin about two weeks before the (German course) orientation session is scheduled to have sufficient time to find housing. More about housing: https://www.tu.berlin/en/go41781/

ESTIMATED LIVING EXPENSES

Housing €350-650 per month / food and drink €150 per month / books and supplies €40 per month / health insurance (if not waived) € 100 per month / Public Transport approx. €180 per semester (reduced Deutschland Ticket) Students who apply for a visa/residence permit have to prove sufficient financial resources of €934 per month – this will give you a rough estimate of what the average student needs. Depending on the individual life style this can be less or more, though.

TUB SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OVERSEAS STUDENTS

Depending on available funds, a small number of project scholarships of €1000 will be assigned to selected overseas exchange students each semester. They cannot apply for these scholarships – the assignment depends on a specific set of criteria.

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Language of instruction -

Most courses are in German, but we also offer a growing number of courses in English (mainly on the graduate level).

Course information -

Information about all courses offered at TU Berlin are available through the Module Transfer System. Usually courses that are offered during a winter or summer semester will be offered again the next winter or summer semester.

Course availability

Almost all courses can be attended by exchange students. For some master programs, though, it may be necessaryto have an appropriate academic and/or professional background in order to get admitted, e.g. in architecture or business administration.

Tuition

Exchange students pay tuition to their home universities. However, for enrolment at TU Berlin they have to cover a small contribution to the student social fund (approx. €80).

German Language Preparation

Before the semester starts a preparatory German intensive course is being offered in early September / early March. It costs approx. €295 and students can earn 6 ECTS. Erasmus students are only eligible to take part if they prove German proficiency on the completed A2 level. More info available under www.tu.berlin/en/go15050/

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The Exchange Application

Requirements - \triangleright

Exchange students should be in good academic standing and have to be nominated by their universities participation in our exchange programs. for All exchange students have to fulfill our language requirements, i.e. either have to prove German or English language skills on a certain level when applying. Master students will have to provide a copy of their bachelor degree or an equivalent.

Nomination periods winter semesters March 1 - April 30 summer semesters September 1 - October 31

Application deadlines winter semesters June 1 summer semesters December 1
